Myth 4:

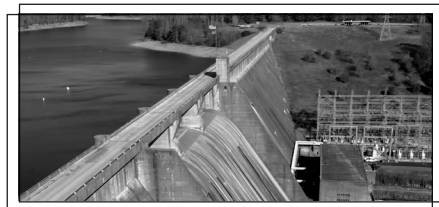
A Bad Credit Score Means You'll Never Be Approved for Anything
